CHRISTMAS CONCERT : YEARS 3 – 6

With apologies for the delay, we can now confirm the date and venue for our Christmas concert. This will take place on the evening of Monday 19th December at St Hilda's Catholic Church on Kenworthy Lane. For this year's concert, we will be joined by a special guest singer, the tenor Martin Toal, who has worked with the children to produce our special Christmas CD and whom some of you will remember from our concerts at Gorton Monastery in 2012, 2013 and 2014. Martin will sing with the children during the concert and perform some solo pieces from his Christmas repertoire. Tickets for this concert will be priced at £4.00 per person and all proceeds from this concert will go to the charity Destination Florida alongside all monies raised from the sale of the Christmas CD. 200 tickets will be made available for this concert.

I want to say how very impressed I was with the children's commitment to this project; they rose to the occasion with enthusiasm and professionalism, resulting in a very accomplished and enjoyable CD of 16 carols and songs performed by the children and three solos performed by our guest singer and organiser of the project, the tenor Martin Toal.
