THEATRE VISITS – DATES FOR YOUR DIARY

We really missed our traditional visit to the theatre following the Christmas holidays this year. Please put these dates in mind and in your family calendar as they are both afternoon performances which means that all children will return to school between 4pm and 5pm on those days. We will ask for voluntary donations for these events nearer the time.

We are delighted to let you know that the selling of the Christmas CD and proceeds from the ticket sales for a wonderful Christmas concert raised an impressive £2,275 for the charity, Destination Florida. We want to thank the children again for their hard work and commitment to this project during last term, which concluded with a special concert at St Hilda's Church where we were joined by tenor Martin Toal and guest musicians Francesca Richardson (violin) and Eleanor McKenna (soprano).



We hope that everyone who came to this event enjoyed it as much as we did. We will be presenting our donation to Paul Bailey from the charity in assembly on Friday morning of this week. We shouldn't ... but we might have to sing a Christmas song before we put the project finally to rest at school, although I know some of you are still playing the CD.

AFTER-SCHOOL CLUB

Booking forms for places for our After-School Club will be available from today. All those parents who are now registered with our After-School Club by email (these parents will have received emails regarding bookings before Christmas) will receive a booking form by email. This can be printed and return by hand or completed in MS Word and returned by email. This half term we have managed to offer places to most families, given some flexibility created by children attending extra-curricular activities. However, places are limited in the interests of providing a safe and quality environment for all children. Paper copies of the booking forms are available from the school office or from After-School Club. Please ensure that you complete and return your booking form as soon as possible. Places will be confirmed on an ongoing basis.

MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

We want to take this opportunity to remind or make clear to parents that the school does not administer medication to children during the school day unless the medication is prescribed by a doctor. We receive many requests for children to be given Calpol and other over-the-counter medicines during the school day, either because they are recovering from an general illness or 'just in case' they do not feel particularly well. However, we do not administer medication to children on this basis and parents need to make arrangements for non-prescribed medicines to be given at other times outside of the school day or by coming into school to administer it themselves. Where a child needs prescribed medication during the school day, this requires a formal arrangement between the school and home and parents must complete a request form and have it agreed by a member of staff. Please do not send your child to school with any medication for them to administer themselves (other than asthma inhalers) or without making formal arrangements with the school office. QUIZ NIGHT – NOT TOO LATE TO ENTER A TEAM

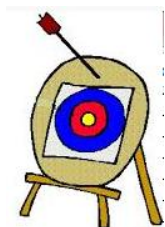

WHOOOPS!

Only 3 of our classes have achieved the 97% target for attendance at this stage of the year. 150 days of absence across the school are due to family holidays taken during term time. If these children had been in school rather than on holiday, attendance would be 97.3%. Year 5 has been significantly affected by illness (80 days affecting 24 pupils) whereas 6 children in Year 4 have had 30 days of authorised family holidays since September. This time last year, our attendance was 97.4%. There has clearly been a decline in our attendance compared to last year, mainly due to parents taking their children on family holidays during term time, all of which, unless there are exceptional circumstances, remain unauthorised

PUNCTUALITY for SCHOOL : SCHOOL STARTS AT 8.50am

We want to remind all parents that school starts at 8.50am (8.45am in the nursery). This is the time at which the bell rings and teachers collect children from the playground to enter school. This is therefore the time by which all children should arrive at school to start the school day. The children have five minutes to organise themselves (coats, bags, water bottles, homework, etc.) and registration (the time at which all children should be sitting in their classrooms) starts at 8.55am. Unfortunately, we are noticing a number of children are arriving late for school on a daily basis.

Please support us by ensuring that your children are in the playground by 8.50am every morning. Thank you for your support.
