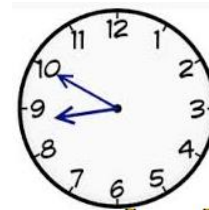
FREE SCHOOL MEALS

If you are receiving benefits (income support, Jobseeker's Allowance, Employment and Support Allowance, child tax credit but not working tax credit or universal credit) please make sure that you register your child as **entitled to free school meals**. We ask you to do this even if your child receives a free meal because they are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 (this is a different entitlement) or your child does not have a school meal. **This is important because the school receives additional funding for every child who is entitled to a free school meal.** This additional funding equates to £1,300 per year per child and can make quite a difference to our relatively small (and possibly reducing) budget. PUNCTUALITY for SCHOOL : SCHOOL STARTS AT 8.50am

Thank you to everyone (parents and children) who is arriving at school on time, that is for 8.50am (or 8.45am in the nursery). We have noticed that the vast majority of children are arriving on time, with just a few children arriving after 8.50am. Children receive a 'Late' mark if they are not registered in class before 9.00am. Thank you for your efforts and support to make sure that your child is at school by 8.50am every day.



NUT FREE ZONE



We would like to remind parents that this school is a **nut-free zone**. Some of our children have allergies to nuts and nut-based products. We therefore aim to restrict children's exposure to products containing or made from nuts. Please do not include nut-based products (including 'Nutella', peanut butter, cereal bars containing nuts) in your children's lunch or snack boxes. Thank you for your consideration and support

USUAL REMINDERS ... PLEASE READ and SUPPORT US

As we usually do at this time of year, we would like to remind all parents that ...

- parents should not drive down or park on Bazley Road when dropping off or collecting children
- children and parents should not enter or leave the premises using the vehicle gates
- parents should adhere to the speeding restrictions (20mph) when in the locality of the school
- children should bring a water bottle (small please) to access drinking water at school
- ensure that PE kits are in school every day and taken home on Fridays for washing
- ensure that homework is completed and returned on time

SUPERVISION and SAFETY OF CHILDREN on SCHOOL PREMISES Please help us to take your children and others safe!

We would also like to ask all parents to ensure that their children remain with them and are properly supervised for their safety at all times when entering and leaving the school premises. We have noted that many children run ahead of parents when entering or leaving the playground, particularly once the side gate has been opened. This is particularly a problem at the end of the school day when some of our youngest children reach the car park or the road with parents nowhere in sight to keep them safe.
