BOOK CHARACTER DAY – THANK YOU



Thank you to everyone who supported our BOOK CHARACTER day last Wednesday. Nearly all of our children took the opportunity to dress up as a character from a book, fairy tale or comic and they all looked wonderful. The children also enjoyed the show given by our visitors *The Pop Project* who took the children on a journey of music associated with children's books. The visitors brought a range of instruments, including their electric guitars, to entertain the children. We will be inviting them back again next year for another of their great shows.

HALLE FOR YOUTH

In what was a busy week for Year 4, they visited the Bridgewater Hall last week to see the famous Halle Orchestra perform on stage. This was part of the Halle Orchestra special concerts designed specifically for school children. This year's theme was World War I and featured music associated with battle, including an orchestral medley and sing-along of the well known tunes '*Pack up your Troubles*' and '*It's a Long Way to Tipperary*'. On this occasion, tickets for this visit were offered free of charge to our school as they were sponsored by Manchester Airport. We would like to thank the Airport Public Relations team for their support.



It is our plan that all children attend at least one orchestral concert by the time they leave our school. This is alongside visits to the theatre, museums, art galleries and lots of other places of interest during their time with us. 
NORTHENDEN NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM

A new organisation has recently been established, giving those who live and work in Northenden a voice in how the village develops in the future. This is known as the *Northenden Neighbourhood Forum* (NNF) and has been established with Government approval and funding. The new Forum has a number of purposes and powers (including considering applications for planning permission). Membership is open to all those who live and work in Northenden.

There will be meeting held at our school on **Wednesday 2nd April starting at 7.30pm** at which the purpose of the Forum will be discussed. All parents are invited to attend. A leaflet has been sent out with this newsletter on behalf of the NNF.

ARTS ACTIVITIES

You will have hopefully noticed at parents' evenings that there were a number of new art displays in different parts of the school, celebrating and showcasing the hard work of the children during the past few weeks. This year's art theme was the *environment* and the children considered this from different points of view. The art work produced was either inspired by the work of landscape or environmental artists, or a living environment.



Of special note is the changed face of the Key Stage 1 corridor and the lovely mural which has been painted by Year 2. Well done everyone and a special thanks to Mrs McAffer and staff for their hard work. Some of the children have also been working with Mrs Cheetham to produce performance pieces based on the *Stomp* show. The children have used recycled materials, old milk bottles, tin cans and brushes to produce different sounds.

PARENTS' QUESTIONNAIRE

With this newsletter, we have sent home a questionnaire for you to complete and return to school before the Easter holidays if you can. The questionnaire aims to gather your views about the school and is divided into three sections. The first section asks the same questions that you would be asked by OfSTED inspectors should the school be inspected. The second section aims to seek your views about communication and parental involvement in the school, whilst the final section aims to gather your thoughts about parents' evenings and the other ways in which we report your child's progress and provide advice for you to support your child at home.

We do value your thoughts and opinions so please spare a few minutes to complete the questionnaire and return it to school before we finish for the Easter holidays.




OLD PRAMS AND DOLLS

It is time again for our annual Easter Egg competition. We are inviting all children to use their imagination to create a scene or character using hard-boiled or blown eggs. As always, there will be Easter egg prizes for the winner in each year group. Please note that entries must be the *children's own work*. It is sometimes obvious that children have been given a significant amount of help and support from parents which makes it very difficult to judge and be fair to all children. We are looking for original ideas and creativity but at the same time that sense that the majority of the hard work has been done by the children themselves. Entries must be brought into school on Thursday 3rd April. Judging will take place that afternoon and winners will be announced on the Friday as we finish for Easter.
