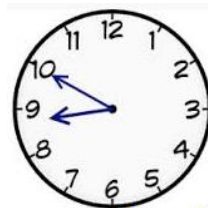
## NORTHENDEN REMEMBRANCE SERVICE

On Thursday, our Year 6 children took part in a service of Remembrance at the Cenotaph in Northenden Village. They were joined by St Wilfrid's CE Primary School and members of the public. Every Year 6 child placed a named memorial cross (of Northenden residents who served in the armed forces and lost their lives in either WWI or WWII) at the Cenotaph.
