CHANGES TO CHARGES

Our Governing Body have recently reviewed the school's Charging and Remissions Policy and have determined that some of our charges for services and tuition will be increasing with effect from 1st September 2018. These are:

Dinner Money and Milk Money

Looking ahead to September, the cost of school meals will be increasing to **£2.30 per meal**, that is **£11.50 per week**. This change is due to increases in the charge made to us by Manchester Fayre, our school meals provider. The cost of milk will remain at **£7.00** (£20 if paid in cash for the whole year in September). Please do not forget that dinner money, milk money and fees for all other activities should always be paid in advance. Thank you for your co-operation. Please do not forget, particularly Year 6 parents, to pay any debts you have remaining with the school to avoid letter invoices being issued during the school holidays.



Instrumental Tuition (Brass and Woodwind)

Due to increases in the charges made to us by our music provider and ongoing budget challenges, we are having to increase our charges for instrumental tuition, that is tuition for brass, clarinet and flute lessons. Charges are increasing by £10 per half-term, from £25.00 to £35.00 per half term. Due to budget constraints, we have had to reduce the subsidy offered by the school for instrumental tuition this year. We do appreciate that these charges were increased last year but they still represent good value for money compared to private tuition.

SCHOOL UNIFORM for SEPTEMBER

We have noticed some 'slippage' in the school uniform worn by some pupils during this year. When you are buying new uniform and shoes, please have in mind that trainers and shoes with flashing lights (they are distracting for everyone) are not part of our school uniform and should not be worn for school. Also, children should not bring large bags to school as we simply do not have enough space to store them. Thank you for your support.

HEALTHY SCHOOL : No Birthday treats please

As part of our aim to improve the health and well-being of our children, we are committed to the Manchester Healthy Schools Framework and to the Government's agendas for increasing children's physical activity and reducing child obesity. We are also committed to supporting the national Change4Life programme (see 'Star Wars' pack sent out with this newsletter).



As part of this aim, from September we will no longer be allowing or supporting the distribution of sweets, cakes or other treats for children's birthdays. Many schools stopped this practice years ago as part of the national Healthy Schools Award initiative. We know that some parents and children will be disappointed by this change but we also know that there will be parents who will welcome it, not least because it reduces the pressure to buy treats for the class and that parents want more control over what their children are given and are eating. This change will mean that potentially 7,000 portions of sweets will no longer be given out at school; this can only be good for the children's health and we ask for your support.

SINGING SUCCESS!



We want to take this opportunity to congratulate and say “very well done” to all of the children who performed in our evening concerts last week. We were so impressed and proud of the children, all of whom sang their hearts out or played solos from *Les Miserables*, *The Greatest Showman*, *Grease*, *South Pacific*, *My Fair Lady*, *Oliver*, *Titanic* and *Phantom of the Opera*, among many others. Thank you, parents, for your lovely feedback regarding our performances.

We would also like to acknowledge the commitment and hard work of our choir, who in addition to performing in our school concerts last week also performed at the Royal Northern College of Music (RNCM). Their set included the rock ballad *Day by Day* from the 1971 musical *Godspell* which was sung beautifully with impressive harmonies. Everyone, including the organisers of the event, was so impressed with the choir, particularly as some of our choir members have only just turned seven years of age and were the youngest performers on the stage at the RNCM. Very well done, choir, and, of course, to their director, Mrs Cheetham.

Now, talking of singing It is not often we get to hear about or mention the success of former pupils of Northenden Community School but we would like to take this opportunity to say “well done” to Natasha Seth (now in Year 8 at Parris Wood High School and who sang alongside the choir from Parris Wood with Ariana Grande at the One Love Concert last year) who has recently appeared on *The Voice Kids* (ITV) and reached the Battle stage this week, having had the pick of all three judges and choosing Will.i.am to be her coach.
