## PARENT VOLUNTEERS WANTED – READING



Can you spare some time to volunteer in school? We are currently looking for a small team of parents or other adult family members who can spare one or two hours each week to read with children, particularly our younger children, during the school day. We have a number of children in school who would benefit from reading with an adult on a daily basis but, given the demands on our staff, we do not always find this possible. Reading volunteers can make a huge difference to children's progress and confidence in reading.

If you feel that you can volunteer your time on a regular (preferably weekly) basis, please let us know by leaving your name and availability at the school office. We will then contact you to arrange a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check. Once these are completed, all volunteers will receive some induction and training on reading with children from our Deputy Headteacher, Mrs Gray. Thank you for your support.

## RECENT CHARITY GIVING AND FUNDRAISING

October and November were months of charitable giving in school. This started with your very generous donations of food and other items for our harvest assembly. The many boxes and bags of donations were gratefully received by the 'Tree of Life' centre in Wythenshawe which works alongside the Wythenshawe Food Bank. In early November we raised money for the Royal British Legion through the purchase of remembrance poppies and other items. Our Year 6 pupils represented the school at a Children's Remembrance Service at the Northenden cenotaph. We received a very nice 'thank you' letter from the Royal British Legion thanking the children for their respect and contribution, and their poem read by four of our pupils. Finally, on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> November, we raised over £440 for Children in Need. Thank you to everyone, particularly our children, for your kind contributions and support for these charities and our local and wider community.



## CHRISTMAS PLAYS AND CONCERTS

Tickets for our Christmas plays (week beginning Monday 10<sup>th</sup> December) and Christmas Concert (Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> December at 7.00pm) are now available from the school office. 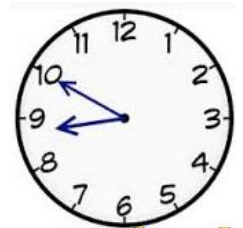
## HEALTHY SNACKS PLEASE



We would like to remind parents of the school's commitment to the Government's Healthy Schools and Change4Life schemes. We have noticed again that some children are bringing in playtime snacks (and have items in their lunch boxes which are being eaten at playtime) which are high in fat, sugar or salt (or all three). These include crisps, cakes, chocolate bars and Pepparami (or similar) sticks. Staff do talk to children about making healthier choices, particularly for their playtime snack. Please take the time to consider your child's playtime snacks and the content of their packed lunch to provide a balanced and nutritious diet. Thank you.

## MORNING ROUTINE (PARENTS in SCHOOL)

We remind all parents that only children and staff are allowed in school when the children enter the building at the beginning of the day. Parents are asked not to enter corridors or classrooms at the beginning or end of the day. If you need to discuss something with a teacher, please make sure that you arrive before 8.50am to be able to catch them before they start their teaching day. Alternatively, you can write a message in the Home-School Message book, leave a message at the school office or ask to make an appointment. Thank you for your co-operation.

We have noticed that quite a few of our reading scheme books (coloured bands) are missing. We know that books can be left or lost at home quite easily. 4 of our 8 classes have achieved a target attendance of 97% so far this year. Others are close. Our nursery children have had a lot of illness so far this year. 112 children in total have had at least one absence due to illness. 14 children have had 58 days of absence due to holidays or other events taken during term time. Our Year 2 and Year 6 classes have the highest number of late marks. Overall, our Year 4 and Year 6 classes have the best attendance and the highest number of pupils with 97% or better attendance.
