ARTS MONTH THE ARTS OF THE CONTINENTS

During this month, we have been focussing on the 'Arts of the Continents' as a whole-school project. In addition to art work in class, the children have been involved in a number of workshops and events involving visitors to our school. The project started with a visit from our friends 'The Pop Project' who took us on a musical journey from North America, through the Caribbean and to South America, exploring some of the great music which came from these continents over a period of time; rock and roll, jazz, reggae, pan pipes and more. The visit of the *Mighty Zulu Nation* was great fun as the children heard the five men sing, in beautiful harmony, songs from South Africa. Children (and staff) took part in singing and dancing workshops, with Mr Arkell taking centre stage at one point in a very energetic dance. Last week, children took part in Indian dance workshops and, in a very short space of time, each class learned a specific dance which was later performed for everyone in school. The last of our visitors are in school on Friday of this week (no assembly) to share the art of Chinese folk dance and music with the children.



SUMMER CONCERT : THU 9TH and FRI 10TH JULY MUSIC OF THE CONTINENTS



To bring our discovery of world-wide arts to a close, the children in Years 3-6 (and Year 2 children in choir) will be performing a concert on Thursday 9th July (at 7.00pm) and Friday 10th July (at 1.15pm). *The Music of the Continents* will be musical journey of the continents, presenting pieces from, about or set in countries and cities around the world.

Tickets are now on sale from the school office priced £2 for adults and £1 for children. Please be sure to buy (or order by phone if you cannot get into school) your tickets for this event. Priority will be given to parents of children who taking part in the concert and tickets will initially be limited to two tickets per family, with all remaining tickets being released on Tuesday 7th July. The arrangements for the concert will be sent home nearer the time but, for now, please note that all children taking part will need to be in school for 6.30pm on Thursday 9th July for the evening performance.

READ FOR MY SCHOOL NATIONAL SUCCESS!

Many of you will remember the national reading competition we ran in the Spring term. This was known as 'Read for My School' and involved children reading online books, recording their reading online and completing book reviews. During the competition, we had one winner, Sophie in Year 6, who won a prize and at the end of the competition we ran our own prize draw of children who had entered the competition.



In addition to the above, I am delighted to let everyone know that one of our pupils, Dimitri in Year 4, won a regional prize for his review of the book *'Itch'* by Simon Mayo (the radio presenter!). Mr Beard, Miss Healey and Dimitri's family travelled to Preston to watch him receive his prize alongside other regional winners.

Now we are even more delighted and proud to announce that Dimitri has won the national book review prize and will be presented, by the Book Trust, with a further award at the Lyric Theatre in London on Thursday of this week. He will be accompanied by his family, Mrs Gray and Miss Healey. We are very pleased for Dimitri and congratulate him on his success.



TEACHERS FOR NEXT YEAR and MISS SANDER

We would normally write out to parents in early July to make clear the staffing arrangements for the following academic year. This year, there will be no changes to the teaching arrangements for each class; all teachers are remaining where they are. There are no teachers leaving and no new appointments planned at this stage. We will not, therefore, write a separate letter to you this year.

However, Miss Sander (Teaching Assistant in Reception) will be leaving us at the end of this term to start her training and career as a class teacher. We are delighted that Miss Sander is moving in this direction, following the achievement of her degree last year, but will be very sad to see her leave her post after 8 years at the school, all of which has been supporting the children in Early Years. I am sure that you will want, in the next few weeks, to wish her well before she leaves.

TRAFFIC COMPLAINTS FROM NEIGHBOURS



Once again, we have to remind parents (and other relatives) about driving and parking on Bazley Road. We have been clear for some time that parents **should not** drive into Bazley Road when dropping off at or collecting children from school and **should not park on Bazley Road at any time during the school day**. It is such a shame that many parents choose to ignore this message; it is, after all, in the interest of children's safety, easing congestion and reducing the risks of an accident.. It is also a shame to hear from neighbours (Bazley Road and Lingard Road) that some parents are speeding down these roads (there is a **20mph** limit in force), blocking driveways and being abusive to residents when challenged, none of which are helpful.

Please **SUPPORT US in this matter .. we do not particularly want to confront people in the street, start naming and shaming or reporting parents to the police**. The need to get to work is not a reason to park near the school – it is this excuse that may well cause an accident one day. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

ACCESS TO SCHOOL – Please use the PEDESTRIAN GATE

Connected to the above is children's and parents' use of the school gates. Please **do not**, even if it is open, **use the vehicle gates** to access the school premises. **Always use the pedestrian gate**. Using the vehicle gates as a short cut with children encourages them to ignore safe practice and our instructions. When the vehicle gate is open (it is closed after 8.30am for the majority of the school day), children and parents should be alert to any vehicle movement entering or leaving the premises. Please **DO NOT OPEN** the vehicle gates if they are closed and please do not be offended if we remind you to use the pedestrian gates if you forget. Thank you.



DEBTS TO SCHOOL

As we approach the end of the school year, we are keen to ensure that all payments we are expecting from parents are up to date so that we do not have to send out reminder letters for any outstanding debts to the school. ATTENDANCE and PUNCTUALITY FOR 2014 – 2015
