## SCHOOL SPORT COMPETITION

Mrs Moran and staff running sports teams have been very busy this term ensuring that we continue our commitment to taking part in competitive sport outside school. During this academic year, the school has taken part in many competitions involving Years 2 and above. We are currently seeking to achieve the School Games Silver Award, having achieved Bronze last year.



92 children from Years 2 – 6 (over 60%) have taken part in competitive sport outside of school, including football, netball (Hi-5), swimming, and futsal since September. Our desire to win a few trophies is worked alongside our aim to engage as many children as possible in competitive sport.

## PHYSICAL ACTIVITY and INTERNAL COMPETITION

This term, our new One Goal coach, Tom Ingham, will be working with some staff and their classes to continue to promote physical activity and exercise. This will include some intra-school competitions where children will complete a number of physical activities (jumping, running, steps, etc.) in a set time (usually 1-2 minutes). These timings will be noted so that children have a record of their personal best which, during the term, they will try to beat. Alongside that, the school houses (Chestnut, Cedar, Pine, Sycamore and Willow) will be awarded points based on their team members' achievement and personal progress. In the lead up to sports day, we will provide opportunities for children to practise their races, again promoting internal competition. Our sports day, weather permitting, is scheduled for Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> June, with a 'reserve' day of Friday 21<sup>st</sup> June.

## PUPILS vs STAFF NETBALL

On the final day of last term, our Hi-5/Netball team, who have competed on two occasions outside school, played a match against a staff team. This rather competitive game was watched by the other children and staff. The children's team played very well but were beaten (7-2) by a very determined (and it has to be said taller!) staff team. There will, no doubt, be a rematch in the summer term.



## YEAR 4 PERFORMANCE (HANSEL AND GRETEL)



We would like to congratulate our Year 4 children on their fine performance in Hansel and Gretel which they performed at Manchester Health Academy last week. The show was the culmination of a few months' of work with MHA drama, music and dance staff working across five local primary schools. The story was the traditional telling of Hansel and Gretel with quite a few musical liberties, including our children's rendition of *I'm Gonna Be (500 miles)* by The Proclaimers (the walk in the woods).

## CYCLE SAFETY / SECURITY

We are pleased that a number of children come to school on their bicycles and scooters. However, we have noticed that some children who cycle to school are doing so without the protection of a safety helmet. It is our policy that all children cycling to school **MUST** wear a safety helmet. This is reinforced in our Bikeability course which takes place in Year 5. We would also like to remind all those with bicycles and scooters to try and secure/lock them to the bicycle racks with a chain and padlock to avoid theft, particularly if left at school overnight or at the weekend. Thank you.

## SPELLING BEE

Our partnership with local schools also includes a number of inter-school competitions which are not about sport. These include the annual spelling bee, maths bee and general knowledge quiz (which is hosted here at Northenden). In the Spring term, we held a Spelling Bee in school (staff were quizzed too!) from which five children from Years 2 – 6 were chosen to represent the school (two children competing) at the Spelling Bee final at Sandilands Primary School. Button Lane won overall but Northenden came a respectable 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place.



## EARLY YEARS BUILDING

We are delighted to report that the repairs and some refurbishment of ceilings and flooring has now been completed in our Early Years Building, following the flood which occurred in February. Following the flood, our nursery and reception children were being taught in the main building, including in the school hall. Although this was a challenge and everyone in school had to make adjustments, the team work of staff, children and parents was outstanding. The Early Years staff and children moved back into the EYFS building on our return from the Easter holidays. Thank you to everyone for your support during this time. The children were particularly wonderful at adapting so quickly to changing circumstances.

WHOOPS!

Well done to Year 1, Year 4 and Year 5 who have achieved 97% or better attendance. Although nearly there, we are missing our ambitious 97% attendance target for the whole school. Of the 1029 days of absence so far this year, 208 days (28 pupils) of absence were due to family holidays being taken during term time which were all unauthorised. The number of children arriving late in Year 2 is very noticeable against that of other classes. There are 14 children with persistent (more than 10%) absence.
