DAY	MATHEMATICS TASK	ENGLISH TASK	OTHER SUBJECT TASKS
Monday	<p>Today's Maths is all about Finding one more and one less</p> <p>Watch the video and complete the worksheet One more one less (first part of worksheet)</p>	<p>Spelling - Look at your spellings for this week and complete your first Write/Cover and the activity sheet.</p> <p>Writing – Put your spelling words into sentences. Remember to include capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Can you make your sentences more interesting by including adjectives?</p>	<p>Topic – Toys – Important Changes</p> <p>You are going to be looking at how toys have changed. Look at 'Important Changes presentation' then play the game. If you can't print it off maybe create your own game or use a game you already have and ask the questions.</p>
Tuesday	<p>Today's Maths is all about Finding one more and one less</p> <p>Watch the video and complete the worksheet One more one less (second part of worksheet)</p>	<p>Phonics – Alien words (nonsense words)</p> <p>Firstly we will be learning the sound /ir/ - 'whirl and twirl'. Please watch the video on Seesaw.</p> <p>Today you are going to be creating your own aliens and the planets they live on. Have a look at the activity sheet provided, Write a sentence for each sound, there is an example on the sheet You can then draw a picture of your alien and planet.</p>	<p>Music – Pulse</p> <p>Today we are going to be using Oak Academy for our music lesson. We will be exploring how we can find the pulse and creating different patterns. Watch the video and follow along. You will need your yellow book, a pencil and also a teddy! Pause the video and have a go at drawing your own pattern. Take a video of you performing your pattern and upload it to Seesaw.</p>

Wednesday	<p>Today's Maths is all about Comparing objects within 50</p> <p>Watch the video and complete the worksheet Compare objects within 50</p>	<p><u>Writing – Question Marks</u></p> <p>Watch the video about question marks and complete the activity sheet provided.</p> <p>Next listen to the story, ‘Why do stars come out at night?’ on Seesaw. Your task is to think of your own question inspired by the questions asked in the story. Then try to think of a creative answer for the question. There is an activity sheet provided for you to use.</p>	<p><u>Science – Everyday Materials</u></p> <p>Today you are going to be conducting your own experiment. Poor Ted has gotten wet in the rain and we are going to test different materials and work out which one will be best to make Ted an umbrella. Look at the presentation and see how you can conduct the experiment, we will also look at this in our Zoom session. Then complete the worksheet with your findings.</p>
Thursday	<p>Today's Maths is all about Comparing numbers within 50</p> <p>Watch the video and complete the worksheet Compare numbers within 50</p>	<p><u>Reading comprehension</u></p> <p>Complete the comprehension worksheet for week 5 provided in your packs.</p> <p><u>Spelling test</u></p> <p>Complete your spelling test for the week, ask an adult to test you on your spellings.</p>	<p><u>Design Technology –</u></p> <p>Today we are going to look at paper toys and how to make them. There is pack with templates and instructions for making different paper toys. You can pick one or as many as you would like you make. Once you have made your toy think about: which parts went well, what was tricky and how you could improve your toy. Please upload photos to Seesaw, I can't wait to see what you create!</p>
