


Materials

What are most of your toys made from?




Technology

Safety Rules



Toys are now much safer than they were in the past. Toys are tested before they are sold to make sure they are safe enough for children to play with. There are also lots of rules which toy makers have to follow to ensure their toys are safe.

Many toys also show which age they are appropriate for. This helps adults to choose toys which are safe for their children to play with.
