Monday	<p>Today's Maths is all about Use Arrays</p> <p>Watch the video and complete the worksheets</p> <p>Use Arrays</p>	<p><u>Spellings</u> All of our spellings are included in our packs and I have labelled them into each week. This week we will be looking at adding suffixes to words (to get those sought after blue highlighters in our writing marking!)</p> <p>Complete the look, cover, write check Term 2, Set1 Week 1(a) sheets with the suffixes –y, -er, -est, -ed and –ing. Have a go at the practice worksheet ready for our test on Friday!</p>	<p><u>Geography</u> We will be starting our new topic of India first, but before that I would like to find out what you have remembered from your geography lessons in Year 2!</p> <p>In your packs you have the continents jigsaw puzzle Cut out and arrange the seven continents in the correct place on the world map. For an extra challenge see if you can locate India <i>Hint: It is in the continent of Asia!</i></p>

Read each question carefully and circle the correct answer from the multiple choice. <i>hint: refer back to the text to check your answers!</i></p>	<p><u>R.E</u></p> <p>Our new topic in R.E is Judaism! Follow the link to the Oak Academy website where you can watch an introductory video all about the Jewish religion. Our first video explains the meaning of the word 'covenant' and introduces an important Jewish man called Abraham. Have a go at the quiz at the end! Friday	<p>Today's Maths is all about 10x table</p> <p>Watch the video and complete the worksheets 10x table</p>	<p><u>Spellings</u> Complete your spelling test today and post your score to Seesaw. Each pack uses our skills in school to practise our letters. Use the examples to complete our caterpillar letters worksheets of the letters c and a today.
