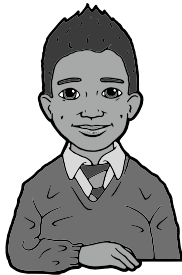

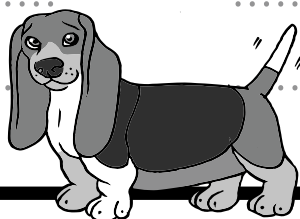


I'm collecting all **ch** words that sound like they have been spelt with a **sh**.



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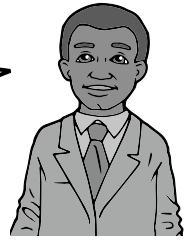


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Some words are called **homophones** or **near-homophones**. These are words that sound the same, but are spelt differently and have different meanings.
