DAY	MATHEMATICS TASK	ENGLISH TASK	OTHER SUBJECT TASKS
Monday	Today's activity is about subtracting mixed numbers. The only difference is that the whole number might change in your answer. For example, if you have three and one quarter and you subtract three quarters, then the whole number isn't going to be three anymore because you have taken away too much.	Please use the worksheets attached to practice this week's spellings. You will find the normal worksheets that you get each week to practice the words and then some tasks to help you learn the words. If you are not sure what any of them mean, use a dictionary or look online to define them. You can find the practice sheets here , and the activities here . At the end of the week, ask an adult or someone at home to test you. Good luck!	History Please read pages 34-35 of Viking Invaders and Settlers on Curriculum Visions . This section of the book is titled The Vikings Invade and is all about what happened when the Vikings invaded the British isles. When you have finished reading, answer the questions about the text.
Tuesday	In today's lesson you will be subtracting one mixed number from another. By now you should be feeling quite confident at working with fractions and mixed numbers, and finding common denominators. You will need to use these skills to complete today's task .	This week we will be editing and upgrading your version of The Fisherman and His Wife. Today's editing lesson is all about punctuation. You need to read your story and using a highlighter or a coloured pencil, underline any missing punctuation. This should include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Capital letters and full stops - Commas, exclamation marks and question marks - Speech marks Once you have highlighted, you can fix any errors.	French Today's lesson is about saying whether you do or do not have certain animals as pets in your household by writing sentences in French? If I said, "Je n'ai pas de chat", what would I be telling you? Please complete the activity .

DAY	MATHEMATICS	ENGLISH TASKS	OTHER SUBJECT TASKS
Wednesday	<p>Today we are going to be thinking about multiplying fractions. This might seem tricky, but it is not as challenging as you might think. Think about this example:</p> <p>If a cake is cut into fifths and you eat three slices, then you have eaten three fifths. So one fifth multiplied by three must be three fifths. Take a look at the Seesaw lesson and then complete the activity.</p>	<p>This lesson will be live on Zoom if you are available to tune in. We will be working together to complete this task and discussing it as we go along.</p> <p>If you're not able to attend the Zoom lesson then please complete the comprehension activity independently.</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Today we will be looking at the ways that scientists from the past studied the features of plants. During the Victorian era, explorers went out into undiscovered parts of the world and needed to document the new forms of wildlife discovered. Botanical drawings like the examples I have attached enabled them to do that. Today I would like you to find a plant, either in your garden or elsewhere and draw it using the botanical drawing style. Your previous work on still life drawing will help you.</p>
Thursday	<p>Today's lesson builds on the skills you used yesterday. The only difference is that you will be working with non unit fractions. I will explain this in today's Seesaw video.</p> <p>Watch the video and then complete the activity.</p>	<p>Today I would like you to use the editing sheet attached to pick 5 sentences from your writing and upgrade them. The sheet explains how you could upgrade your writing and gives examples for you to follow. This task includes a lot of the grammatical techniques we have been learning so far this year and you should aim to try all of the different methods.</p>	<p>Art Today I would like to assess the skills you have been building on over the past few weeks. I would like you to produce either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A still life drawing of a shoe - A self portrait <p>You can choose which subject to draw and I will be using your submissions to create a Lockdown Art Gallery to share your works.</p>
Friday	<p>For the final lesson for the week we will be multiplying mixed numbers. For this, partitioning will be really useful. For example, if you are multiplying four and one third by three, multiply the whole numbers first and then use the method from the previous lesson to multiply the fractions. Watch today's video example on Seesaw and then complete the activity.</p>	<p>Today I would like you to write up a final copy of your story including any of the upgrades you made in the previous lessons this week. I have attached a booklet for you to use for this, including a page for you to design your own front cover for the story and space for an illustration to go halfway through the story.</p> <p>Today you should also ask someone to test your spellings. Good luck!</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Today we will be looking a real account of a Viking invasion. The Anglo Saxon Chronicle described the events of the Viking invasion of Lindisfarne. Please read the article on the worksheet and use the space below to makes some notes on the things you think are important about it. We will be discussing it on today's Zoom lesson.</p>
