Monday	<p>In this lesson I would like you to make a poster that I could use in the classroom to help people solve word problems. Your poster should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Include an examples of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division word problems.</li><li>- It should show examples of the methods you need to use to solve the problems.</li><li>- It should include some advice about what you need to do when solving word problems.</li></ul> <p><b>Challenge</b> For an extra challenge, create two-step word problems and mix the operations needed to solve the problem. For example, you might need to subtract and then multiply to solve the problem.</p>	<p>For the final writing lesson of the year, I would like you to write a news story about yourself or your class! Can you think of something that has happened during Year 5 that you could write a news story about? Here are some ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- The pandemic and having a successful year despite such unprecedented conditions.</li><li>- A sporting achievement</li><li>- An Academic achievement</li><li>- A report on an enjoyable event in school such as Geoff Scargill's visit or making bread</li></ul> <p>Remember to use the who, what, where, when and why/how structure that we have been working on, and try to make your news report about something positive. You can also think of a headline, and include a picture and a caption if you want to. I would like you to celebrate your achievements and experiences from this academic year!</p>	<p><b>History</b> If you could write a letter to Sir Edward Watkin, what would you say?</p> <p>In this lesson I would like you to send a letter back in time to the Victorian Era. Think about what you could tell Mr Watkin about the modern world that might interest him, or the kind of questions that you could ask him. Maybe you'd like to know how he felt about the incomplete Watkin tower or ask him about whether he thinks his work be studied in schools in the future?</p> <p>I would like to pass some of your letter on to Geoff Scargill, as he has mentioned that this would be a fascinating task and I think he would enjoy reading your letters to the man who his studies revolve around.</p>
