We are going to be writing it in stages, starting with the <a href="#">planning stage</a>. To plan your story I would like you to use comic strip. This page also gives you some ideas about what to base your story on. Choose one of the photos to inspire your writing!</p>	<p><b>History</b> – This week we are going to be exploring Viking clothing with two different tasks. First, you will need to read pages 24 and 25 of Viking Invaders and Settlers on Curriculum Visions. <b>Task 1:</b> Use <a href="#">the template</a> to draw and label a Viking in full Viking clothing. Your labels should explain details about the item clothing such as its purpose and what they are made from. <b>Task 2:</b> Use the pages you have read in Viking Invaders and Settlers to complete the <a href="#">comprehension about Viking clothing</a>. Remember to answer in full sentences and give lots of detail.</p>
Wednesday	<p>Visit the <a href="#">White Rose website</a> and select this week From each daily lesson you can also access the <a href="#">BBC's BiteSize lessons</a> for the same topic.</p> <p><b>Today's Lesson</b> <a href="#">Fractions of an amount</a></p>	<p>Today you are going to be writing the <a href="#">beginning of the story</a>. This part of the story should introduce the characters and the setting. There should be lots of descriptive language, to give the reader a good idea of who your story is about and where the story is taking place.</p>

This is where the action happens! Your writing should be exciting, suspenseful and should describe the main events of the story. This is where the characters should encounter some kind of problem that needs to be solved!</p>

Also, complete your <a href="#">Times Tables Rock Stars</a> challenges.</p>	<p>Finally, you are going to <a href="#">write the ending to your story</a>. In this part of the story the plot should be wrapped up and most problems from the middle should be solved, although you could end on a cliff-hanger! Don't forget to ask someone to test your spellings!</p>	<p><b>RE</b> – Last week marked the end of Ramadan for people of the Muslim faith. <a href="#">Complete the activity</a> to find out more about Ramadan, Eid and why it is an important event in the Muslim calendar.</p>
