Test yourself once at the beginning of the week, and then ask someone to test you again at the end of the week. Spend the days in-between practising the words you didn't get right the first time!</p>	<p>PE – This week I would like you to invent a playground game. This should be a game that could be played at playtime or lunchtime and should use the equipment we already have in school. It could be based on an existing sport like football/rugby or be totally original!</p>

An ellipses looks like this “...” and come at the end of a sentence. We used these when writing stories with cliff-hangers at the beginning of the year. Complete the activity sheets about using ellipses.</p>	<p>Art – This week I would like you to make a collage using recycled material. Things like empty cereal boxes, old newspapers and magazines, and anything else that would be thrown away are what you're going to be using. You can choose what to make your picture of, but I want you to think about how you can create texture, colour variation and how you can represent the shapes your subject using scraps of paper.</p>

Make sure you pay attention to the example!</p>	<p>I have attached some examples of lovely collage work that might inspire you. You are welcome to base your ideas around on of the example or create your own!</p>
