Wednesday	How well can you remember the methods we used for multiplication last term? Complete the revision activities on the worksheet. You will need these skills when we move onto fractions next week!	<p>Please use the worksheets attached to practice this week's spellings. You will find the normal worksheets that you get each week to practice the words and then some tasks to help you learn the words. If you are not sure what any of them mean, use a dictionary or look online to define them.</p> <p>At the end of the week, ask an adult or someone at home to test you. Good luck!</p>	Please read pages 4-5 of Viking Invaders and Settlers , the curriculum visions book we will be using to support our learning about Vikings, and answer the comprehension questions on the worksheet. Thursday	Please use the attached worksheets (Sheet 2 and Sheet 3) to continue to revise our work on multiplication using the column method. Remember to take care with your place value, and use the TH/H/T/O columns correctly.	<p>Read the paragraph on your worksheet. There is lots of missing punctuation, or punctuation that is not used correctly. Can you re-write the paragraph and fix the errors.</p> <p>Challenge For an extra challenge, can you find verbs in the text and upgrade them to become powerful verbs when you re-write the paragraph?</p>	<p>The Vikings were famous for being skilled travellers.</p> <p>Pages 4-5 of Viking Invaders and Settlers describes where the Vikings came from, and where they travelled to. Can you find those countries on the map, label them and draw arrows to show where the Viking travelled to? Map</p>
Friday	Today we will be revising the work we did on division before the Christmas break. For the questions you could use place value counters or a chart, or you could use the bus stop method that we practiced in November and December.	<p>Can you remember the three main jobs an adverb or adverbial does in a sentence? They tell us how, when or where something is done. For example: Mr Mallinson carefully arranged the flowers in the vase.</p> <p>The adverb tells us how I acted in the sentence. Complete the activity on adverbs and adverbials.</p>	Do you remember the work we did on still life drawing? We drew our shoe in a careful, detailed way. The objective is to draw an everyday object as accurately, and realistically as possible. I would like you to pick an object from around the house and draw it using this style. All you need is a piece of paper, a pencil and an object of your choice. You do not need to colour the drawing! I have attached some examples of still life drawings to inspire you.
