| DAY       | MATHEMATICS  | ENGLISH TASKS FOR THIS WEEK  | OTHER SUBJECT TASKS   |

| Monday    | <p><b>2D Shape</b><br/>Watch the <a href="#">2D shape song on YOU TUBE</a><br/>Shape Hunt Activity set on Seesaw</p>   | <p><b>Phonics</b><br/>Learn the letter <b>k</b> sound. Watch the <a href="#">Jolly Phonics rhyme</a> and join in with the actions for 'k'.<br/>Watch <b>Mrs Johnston's phonics video</b> lesson on Seesaw.</p>   | <p><b>EAD/CLL</b> using a pot and a spoon or a tub and a stick (whatever you have got), tap out the syllables in your child's name e.g. O –li-vi-a (4 taps) and get your child to copy. Tap out other names or favourite words e.g. "ice-cream", "sun-flow-er", "cat-er-pill-ar".</p> |
| Tuesday   | <p>Practise your cutting skills by cutting out the 2D shapes. Which ones do you know? Can you ask your grown up the names of the others? Use the <a href="#">2DShapeCutting sheet</a> on the website</p>                                     | <p><b>Phonics</b><br/>Watch '<a href="#">Geraldine the Giraffe</a>' on <a href="#">YOU TUBE</a>.<br/>Play I Spy - how many things can you find around the house that begin with <b>k</b>?</p>  | <p><b>EAD/UW</b> 'Little Squirters' give your child a Calpol syringe or a squirty bath toy and see how many different things it can be used for – watering plants, mini water fight, drawing on slabs.</p>  |
| Wednesday | <p>Make a Shape Book – have a look for things around your house/garden that are different shapes. Can you draw them into a shape book ...fold paper to make a zigzag book?</p>   | <p><b>Writing</b><br/>Learn how to write <b>k</b> using the Read, Write Ink sheet in your home learning pack (Down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg.), Ask your child to use their finger in the air, on the table, on grownups back etc. to practice writing '<b>k</b>'.</p> | <p><b>PD</b> Watch <a href="#">Cosmic Kids Yoga on YOU TUBE</a>. If you like the idea of this activity after watching the short video, have a look at their other videos on YouTube.</p>  |
| Thursday  | <p>Go into your garden or a park near your house and collect some sticks, pebbles and leaves. See what 2D shapes you can make using them. Which shapes are easiest to make using the sticks? Which objects are best for making a circle?</p> | <p><b>Phonics</b><br/>Can you make up silly sentences using <b>k</b> words e.g. 'Katie the kangaroo flew on a kite around the kitchen!'</p>  | <p><b>UW/CLL</b> Guess the Animal Game<br/>Ask a grown up to describe an animal, can you guess what it is? Listen carefully to the clues. Here is an example – this animal has 4 legs, can be brown, black or white, and gives us milk. Do you know what animal it is?</p>            |
| Friday    | <p>Can you use you play dough to make 2D shapes?</p>   | <p><b>Speaking &amp; Listening</b><br/>Listen to Mrs Johnston reading the story: '<b>What the Ladybird Heard</b>' on SEESAW. This is the story of a ladybird who lives on a farm and has a grand plan.</p>   | <p><b>Dough Disco</b><br/>Use your dough to join in with the <a href="#">Dough Disco on YOU TUBE</a>.</p>   |
