DAY	MATHEMATICS	ENGLISH TASKS FOR THIS WEEK	OTHER SUBJECT TASKS
Monday	The Counting Jar activity (which you have to activate on Seesaw)	PhonicsWatch Parent and Carers Guide to PronouncingPhonemes on YouTube(stop at 48 secs)Learn the letter c sound. Watch Mrs Johnston'sphonics video on Seesaw.	The Rooms in my House Support your child to create a map of their home. Can they name all the rooms? An adult could hide an object in a room and mark where it is on the child's map. Can they use their map to find the hidden object?
Tuesday	'Monkey Ten' game : Yell "Monkey 10, 9, 8" and count down to zero as you move like monkeys (bonus points for monkey noises). When you get to zero your child chooses a new animal to act out "Zebra 10, 9, 8" and everyone takes turns to lead.	Phonics Watch <u>'Geraldine the Giraffe' on YouTube</u> Play I Spy - how many things can you find around the house that begin with c?	The Rooms in my House Gather an object from each room and challenge your child to return them to the appropriate room e.g. toothbrush from the bathroom, teddy from their bedroom.
Wednesday	Thread Cheerio's onto spaghetti or a wooden/metal cake skewer. Count them as you are putting them on and then eat them! This is also a fine motor task.	Writing Learn how to write c using the Read, Write Ink sheet in your home learning pack (Curl around the caterpillar), Ask your child to use their finger in the air, on the table, on grownups back etc. to practice writing ' c '.	The Rooms in my House Hide objects around the room and describe where it is using the words under , over , behind , in front , next to/beside e.g. "it's under something blue." Can your child hide an object and describe where it is for you to find?
Thursday	Practise counting up to 10. This can be done through playing hide and seek, singing number songs, chanting, board games etc.	Phonics Can you make up silly sentences using c words e.g. 'Colin the caterpillar cut up the cucumber' Recap on the sounds we have learnt so far. Join in with <u>Jolly Phonics rhymes - C</u> .	Find your house on google maps Explore using google maps to look at your house from above and on street view. Use the arrows to move up and down the road and around your area. Can they find key places e.g. the corner shop, their school, grandparents' houses?
Friday	Practise counting with <u>BBC Numberblocks</u>	Speaking & Listening Listen to Mrs Johnston reading the story: ' <i>Jack Frost</i> '	Dough Disco Watch Mrs Johnston's video on Seesaw and follow the actions with your play dough. What can you make with the dough once you have finished.
