| Monday | <p>Maths Lesson 1 (White Rose Maths) Today's challenge is to go for a nature walk (or use objects in your house). Can you create a nature pattern using 3 objects eg.stick, leaf, stone, stick, leaf, stone</p> | <p>Today's story is 'Shark in the Park' (Mrs Singh/You Tube). Can you imagine what would happen is there really was a shark in the park? Use the 'Shark in the Park' activity book (see home learning pack) and see if you can find and colour the Phase 3 sounds included.</p> | <p>Phonics-ar sound For today's story writing task use your Tales Toolkit story board (see home learning pack). Can you write your story of Shark in the Park? Remember to use finger spaces and a full stop. Use the example on Seesaw to help you think of ideas.</p> |
| Tuesday | <p>Maths Lesson 2 (White Rose Maths) Today's challenge is to make a repeating pattern using objects in your house eg.fork, knife, spoon. Can you think what would come next?</p> | <p>For today's story activity read along with 'The Gruffalo' (Mrs Singh/You Tube) Now find the sequencing activity on Seesaw. I think you will do such a good job as we know this story really well.</p> | <p>Phonics-or sound Art Activity 2 (See home learning pack) Can you create a recycled colour wheel using old packaging, magazines etc. Use the activity sheet as a guide but feel free to be as creative as you like. Post your artwork on Seesaw and we can create a gallery.</p> |
| Wednesday | <p>Maths Lesson 3 (White Rose Maths) Today's challenge is to make a repeaating pattern using vegetable printing and paint. If you don't have paint, you could make a colour pattern cutting a sticking old magazines.</p> | <p>Read p1-13 Snails Live like This Let's make our own scrapbook about snails. You can use sellotape or string to stick your pages together and use cardboard from an old box for the front cover. Today's task is to design your front cover. Remember to put your name on because you are the author!</p> | <p>Phonics Dance-The Wizard of Oz Do you remember the story? For this week's dance lesson we are going to be retelling 'The Wizard of Oz' using our bodies.</p> |
| Thursday | <p>Maths Lesson 4 (White Rose Maths) Today's challenge is to make a fruit kebab using a repeating pattern. If you don't have any skewers you place your fruit in rows or print with paint.</p> | <p>Read p13-27 Snails Live like This Draw and write 3 of your favourite facts about snails that you have found out whilst reading the book. I found a song that I thought you might like called The Snail Song</p> | <p>Phonics-ow sound Role Play-From your photographs on Seesaw, you really enjoyed playing shop last week. Some of you were using real money too. This week I would like you to open a café. Can you write your own menu with a price list? Maybe your teddies will visit your café too.</p> |
| Friday | <p>Today's lesson is based on 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' Here is the autor Michael Rosen reading the story. Maths Lesson 5 (White Rose Maths) Today's challenge is to find some long and short objects, wide and narrow objects that you can use to create some repeating patterns.</p> | <p>Read p27-41 Snails Live like This This is our last day making our snail scrapbook. For today's activity write 3 more facts you would like your reader to know about snails. Maybe you could read your book to me by posting a video on to Seesaw.</p> | <p>Phonics-review of the week Well Done Assembly-It's assembly day and you are the teacher. Find a certificate in your home learning pack and write a message to your Star of the Week. You could even have your own assembly at home.</p> |
