Monday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 1(White Rose Maths)</a> Today's challenge is to gather and label collections of 4 objects. Remember when you write the number 4 it looks like a L with a leg.</p>	<p>Today's story is <a href="#">‘The Storm Whale’</a> In the story Noi finds a little whale who he cares for. Use your story maker (home learning pack) to write your own story. What animal might you find and where? How would you look after it and how would you get it home to their family in the end?</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the ‘igh’ sound</a> For today's writing task watch <a href="#">Whale Facts</a> and make a fact page (or book) about whales. Do you have any questions you'd like to find out about? Ask a grown up to help you to research more facts on the computer.</p>
Tuesday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 2 (White Rose Maths)</a> Today's challenge is to gather and label collections of 5 objects. Remember when you write the number 5 we say ‘here is the nose and here is a hat’</p>	<p>For today's story Nick Butterworth is going to read his story <a href="#">‘After the Storm’</a> Can you draw your favourite part of the story and write a sentence? I like it when ...</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the ‘or’ sound</a> Art Activity-In the story ‘The Storm Whale’ Noi painted his friend the whale because he liked thinking about him. For this week's art activity I would like you to draw or paint something you like thinking about. Don't forget to post your art on Seesaw so we can see your picture.</p>
Wednesday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 3(White Rose Maths)</a> Today's challenge is to gather together groups of 4 and 5 objects then match the numerals 4 and 5 to the correct groups.</p>	<p>Read <a href="#">‘The Wind’</a> This week's book practises Phase 3 sounds. Can you read along with the audio then pause so you can try sounding the words out independently.</p>	<p>Phonics-sh sound <a href="#">‘The Fish Who Could Wish’</a> Find your copy in your home learning pack and complete the Phase 3 reading activity. Now for Dance- <a href="#">Squish the Fish</a> we are going to be retelling using our bodies.</p>
Thursday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 4(White Rose Maths)</a> Today's challenge is to investigate how many different ways you can make 4; <math>3+1=4</math>, <math>4+0=4</math>. Don't forget to label your investigations.</p>	<p>Read <a href="#">‘The Wind’</a> Revisit yesterday's reading book and see if you are becoming more fluent when reading your Phase 3 sounds.</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the ‘oo’ sound</a> We have learnt about snails and whales. Here is Julia Donaldson reading her book <a href="#">‘The Snail and the Whale’</a> For role play this week can you find two toys/teddies one that is big and one that is small. They can become friends and travel the world like in the story.</p>
Friday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 5(White Rose Maths)</a> Today's challenge is to investigate how many different ways you can make 5; <math>4+1=5</math>, <math>5+0=5</math> Don't forget to label your investigations.</p>	<p>Today we are going to play a word hunt game. Using your reading book <a href="#">‘The Wind’</a> and see if you can find and write down words with these sounds; ow (blow), ll, ee, ow (cow), ou, oo (zoo), igh and ng. You have done amazingly well if you find all eight sounds. Here's a reminder of <a href="#">How to say our sounds.</a></p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the ‘oo for book’ sound</a> Well Done Assembly-It's assembly day and you are the teacher. Find a certificate in your home learning pack and write a message to your Star of the Week. You could even have your own assembly at home.</p>
