DAY	MATHEMATICS	ENGLISH TASKS FOR THIS WEEK	OTHER SUBJECT TASKS
Monday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 1(White Rose Maths)</a> For today's challenge make or print off ladybirds with spots totally 6,7,8 then play a matching game. How many different ways can you find of making 6,7 or 8 spots on two wings?</p>	<p>Today's reading book is '<a href="#">Night Animals</a>' Today we are focusing on reading the 'igh' sound. Pause the book and try reading each sentence independently. Remember read the sounds, then blend the word.</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the 'igh' sound</a> Here's a reminder of <a href="#">How to say our sounds</a>. For today's writing task watch <a href="#">Animals at Night</a> and make a book where you draw and label which animals are awake at night. Why are these animals awake at night and what do they do?</p>
Tuesday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 2(White Rose Maths)</a> For today's challenge explore making and labelling pairs to 10 (then 20). You can use objects around the house or from nature.</p>	<p>Today's reading book is '<a href="#">Light</a>' Play '<a href="#">Guess My Shadow</a>' game then why not have a try at making your own animals by making shadow puppets with a torch. This clip might help you think of some ideas '<a href="#">Shadow Puppets</a>'</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the 'ar' sound</a> Yesterday we learnt about night animals, today watch the clip <a href="#">Star Gazing</a>. When it gets dark have a go at star gazing and see how many stars you can see. Do you remember our class story <a href="#">How to Catch a Star</a>?</p>
Wednesday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 3(White Rose Maths)</a> For today's challenge make a tens frame and have a go at some addition calculations using 6,7,8. Use counters if you have them, or play dough or raisins etc. Don't forget to write your number down when you find the answer.</p>	<p>Watch '<a href="#">Let's Celebrate</a>' and then this short clip to tell you more about <a href="#">Chinese New Year</a> Today's book is a chinese fairy tale called '<a href="#">The Willow Pattern Story</a>'. Draw the pattern after reading to see what you remember from the story. Here is a <a href="#">clip</a> from the art gallery to help you.</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the 'or' sound</a> For our art activity this week we are making <a href="#">Chinese Lanterns</a>. The <a href="#">video</a> shows lanterns being set off into a night time sky. These lanterns symbolize good memories you do not want to forget. Draw or write a memory you want to keep and put it inside your lantern.</p>
Thursday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 4(White Rose Maths)</a> For today's game we are adding up how many domino spots we have altogether. You can make your own dominoes using old card and a black pen if you don't have any at home already.</p>	<p>For today's story read along with <a href="#">The Great Race: The Story of the Chinese Zodiac</a>. I hope you enjoyed the story. For today's writing task draw and label the animals from the race. 2021 is the Year of the Ox. What animal was the year you were born. Here's a <a href="#">song</a> to help you.</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the 'ur' sound</a> For Dance today we have the story <a href="#">Cracker the Dragon of Wonder</a> to help us celebrate Chinese New Year.</p>
Friday	<p><a href="#">Maths Lesson 5 (White Rose Maths)</a> Make and label a number track to 20. You could use old card or paper. Have a go at playing the number track game adding the two numbers together.</p>	<p>For today's story we are reading '<a href="#">Chester Choi</a>' a beautiful story from Manchester Art Gallery. Today's task is to watch the <a href="#">clip</a> and follow the instructions of how to make a dragon using an old egg box. In the video they use googly eyes but it is great to get creative and draw your own. If you don't have an egg box you can draw on paper.</p>	<p>Phonics-<a href="#">the 'ow' sound</a> Well Done Assembly-It's assembly day and you are the teacher. Find a certificate in your home learning pack and write a message to your Star of the Week. You could even have your own assembly at home.</p>
